- (f) Religion discourages people to accumulate wealth for own sake. It directs man to live a simple and clean life.
- (g) Religion enhances tolerance amongst each other of different religion.
- (h) Religion directs man to learn divine knowledge
- (i) Religion inspires man to do social service for and modern education. mankind without any prejudice
- (j) Religion creates confidence to speak truth and support what is right at any cost.

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CHAPTER 3

Crisis, Kinds and Causes:

This chapter would help students to understand that how the lack of religious education and ignorance indulges man to temptation, greed and corruption which consequently create problems and crisis for these people. There are wo kinds of crisis; Natural crisis and artificial crisis. Natural crisis is the result of anger of GOD due disobedience and misconduct of man such as corona, famine, or flood, etc. Artificial crisis are created by alleged men and traders in order to aggrandize profit or, achieve some other notorious and vicious personal designs against government or state or people. However the artificial crisis can be handled judiciously through good administration, diplomatic skill and pre empties measures and strategy.

Pakistan by Grace of Allah is not only agriculturist country but is rich in all mineral and natural resources than a other rich and developed nation of the world. What pity that since creation of Pakistan, the country and i's people are suffering from poverty, ignorance, illiteracy cy; There are countless reasons which are now Known to everyone now.

It is a shame that generally every year we get bumper crops of wheat, rice, sugarcane vegetable, fruits and other cercal and geniuses but the general consumers not only pay the higher prices for abundantly produced crops of wheat, rice, sugar etc. in the country but also suffer from its acute shortage. This is called the artificial crisis generated by unscrupulous traders. Who allegedly concealed its huge stocks from the government and release in local market at high prices This is a sin and a crime against people and state.

The life of the people becomes miserable. They are forced to buy at higher prices of essential goods. Price hike block the economy progress. It affects all aspects of life

In recent past our country has faced artificial food crisis one after the other beside a pandemic corona virus.

In a local village one Dino farmer approached to a shop for buying flour (Wheat). He was to pay high price. Surprisingly, he asked one learned man of village Master Sanwal why the flour was so expensive when every year we produce bumper crops of various cereals. He told him that there are unpatriotic and unscrupulous businessman creates artificial crisis for making huge profit at the cost of suffering of people. They purchase most of the crops at higher prices from the farmers than government purchasing rate. Store them, export and smuggle them at higher prices. As the result government is failed to supply cereals commodities to processing mills markets, and shops etc.





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The artificial crisis can however, be sorted out through religious education, stern and efficient administrative action and better planning.

Many suggestions can be given to the State and government how to eliminate the artificial crisis tradition from our culture in Pakistan. A few suggestions are as under:-

- (i) Government must lay down some principles of business ethics for all businessman whether small or tycoon. They should sign the business ethics charter before entering into business.
- (ii) Their performance according to the business ethics are to be checked time to time with accountability consequences.
- (iii) All businessmen also should attend every year some religious session as to keep always fresh in memory and practice business ethics.
- (iv) Government must make sure to buy and store the products according to the need of the country.
- (v) Control black marketing and smuggling.
- (vi) Regularize all business and trading ventures.
- (vii) Establish public markets and sell shops at concessional prices so that the goods are sold at reasonable price by the shopkeepers

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CHAPTER 4

CRIMES AND SINS

The brief discussion under this title would enable students to distinguish between crimes and sins

Crime

It can be simply defined when Govt. /State laid down rules, law and procedure are violated, it becomes crime and it is punished under the. law and the constitution.

Sin

When divine rules as explained in holy Quran sunnah are discarded and ignored it becomes sin.

Most of the crimes are also punishable sins, Sum as dacoity, theft, adulteration, fraud, cheating etc. but many of sins are not crimes such as not performing prayers, . not keeping fast, backbiting, greed, anger, thanklessness etc.

Man is liable to commits error. It is in his nature. At the same time to. control and regulate his nature under the holy guidance is also very much in his capacity. However in all religions Allah has clearly identified what are punishable sins.

In Islam, lies, greed, lust for wealth, haughtiness, lasciviousness, Drinking, Obscenity, rape, murder, adulteration, dishonesty etc are sins.

Kabeer (Major/big Sins)

Those sins which are unpardonable, God would not forgive them such as shirk (to share authority of Allah with some other things, murder of innocent person etc.

In all other religions, including Christianity, Hinduism, Judaism Buddhism, Sikhism etc. all above mentioned are sins in their religions. With exceptions of a few human vices weaknesses which are sins but not crimes but what are crimes all of them are almost sins. The sins and crimes both defy the divine injunctions of Allah, State and government. Both sins and crimes are against ethics, morality and humanity and causes suffering to the people

Mankind is the most favored creation of God who loves and has bestowed upon man numerous favor and blessing and made humans superior to all creatures on earth. All other creatures serve the desire of mankind. Therefore, man should always be most thankful and submissive to Allah for his kindness and mercy and always pray and supplicate his forgiveness and always be obedient to his command. He must save and protect himself from all sins and crimes.





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Crimes; Being the citizen of the state which provide us the State identity, all opportunities of growth and development of personality therefore, It is the duty of every citizen to honor the solidarity of the State and sovereignty by adhering to its constitution, and by patriotism. We must not violate its law and order and invest our all resources in the development of the state. When we violate and disregard the legitimate action to the unconstitutional act that act become a crime which is punishable crime.

Man is liable to error not because Hazrat Adam had tasted a forbidden food in the heaven but the conflict between right and wrong, between good and evil etc. had been already placed in nature of man by Allah as to draw a line between obedient and disobedient people

Some ancient societies also had concepts of corporate, or collective, sin (see original sin) affecting all human beings and dating from a mythical "fall of man" out of a state of primitive and blissful innocence. In ancient Greek thought, sin was looked upon as, in essence, a failure on the part of a person to achieve his true self-expression and to preserve his due relation to the rest of the universe; it was attributed mainly to ignorance.

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CHAPTER 5

JAINISM

Jainism:

Jainism is the one of the oldest religion of the subcontinent. The meaning of Jain is the conqueror of own Self. That means that all his carnal desires as, human being are strictly controlled / subjected to his command.

The followers of, this cult' are called Janis. Their religious leaders are called Tirthankara, the founder of Jainism is Rishabh Adera. When the tradition holds that he has lived million years ago. Mahavira Dir. around 600 BCE is the last Tirthankara of the current times.

They believe that every Cycle of cosmology is controlled and guided by tirthankara. None of the tirthankara has ever claimed himself as the God but considered oneself as ordinary human being whose Job is to save the soul of People from bad and evils deeds (Karma)

Their fundamental belief that all living creatures on earth in Water and air are to protected and respected. They should not be harmed at any cost.

As to care for all living being all Janis cover their mouth with cloth as that not even. The current of air accidentally push insects into their mouth and it gets injured. They walked without shoes so no worm is crushed under their feet. They prepare their foods in day light so that insects, worm flies or moth etc. do not get burn from flames of candle or Stove. They do not eat those vegetables which are rooted out from the soil field like potato, onion, garlic etc. because it causes injury and death to various earthy worms and insects. Therefore, the Janis are strict vegetarian.

During early days of Jainism there was no tradition to establish Temples but later on temples were built and statutes of tirthankara were displayed in temples.

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CHAPTER 6

MAHAVIR

Mahavira

This chapter would enable students to understand the cult of Jainism and the contribution of philosophy of Mahavir 24thTirthankara the last spiritual leader of Jainism.

Mahavira the 24thTirthankara before his birth in sixth century (599 BCE in kundagrama Vaishali vajji (Present district Bihar India, underwent 27 rebirth according to universal history of Jain Text. His rebirth included the denizen of hell, a lion, and a god (Deva) in heavenly realm just before his last rebirth as 24thTirthankara. Mahavira is also known as Vira, Ativira, vardhaman sanmate, Nayanputta, Kashyapa, Kavala.

He was born in royal family. He grew up as prince. His father name was Siddhartha raja and his mother name was Trishala. In early age he was married to Yashoda and had a daughter Piryadavshana.

At the age 30 he left his palace and royal life in pursuit of spiritual ecstasy and awakening and becoming an ascetic.

He practiced intense meditation, severe austerities. He under took severe fast and body mortification. Discarded his clothes and sat down under the Ashoka tree for 12 and a half year. Until he attained Kavala (omniscience's or infinite / (knowledge). Janis believes that after the rigorous penance for such long period he had acquired most auspicious body which was free from 18 imperfections.

He returned to the people and travelled throughout India 5. and preached his doctrine for 30 years. His mission was to relieve men from agony of life and death so that atter death the rebirth, the soul does not suffer from bad karma (actions) of worldly life. And the soul could enjoy peace and happiness forever.

According to Jainism cult there is no creator or Supreme Being and existence has neither beginning nor end, his sermons attracted thousands of people who adopted his cult and philosophy and became Janis who are mostly found in India, Japan Canada and Pakistan and in other countries.

The most of the philosophy of Jainism lost. According to Diganmbava text on palm leaves there are five. Vows (Vratas) of ethics of Jainism which Jain Agamas enumerates. Their brief version- is as under.

Ahimsa (non violence or non injury). All living beings whether man, animals, earth, worms and insects are to be' protected, respected, not to be harmed at any cost this vow applies to action, speech and thought. They are vegetarian.





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- 1. Satya (truthfulness) to one self and others
- 2. Asteya (non-stealing) not taking anything that has not been given or in possession
- 3. Brahmacharya (Chastity) not indulging in sex and sensual pleasure for monks and 'faith fullness to one's partners and house holders.
- 4. Aparigraha not greed and accumulate wealth of one has the wealth to be spend all in charity and not own anything

Besides Jains are to control anger disgust pride, ego, greed, temptation, etc. Live simple, free and harmless life for the salvation of his soul from any curse after death and reborn freely and happily forever.

Church:

Christianity is divided into various sections and groups according to their schools, of thought. The structure of their, churches and religious proceedings insides churches also slightly different from other. The major Christian's groups or churches are currently known as orthodox churches, the Roman Catholic., Churches protestant. churches, the Lutheran churches. The Calvinist churches, Angelic or churches of England, and free churches. The main difference among all these churches, the orthodox and Roman Catholic churches use various symbols and aids to worship. Pray to Virgin Mary and the saints and accept the authority of bishops and priests.







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Christian Worship Allah in their churches. According to the manners of worship their churches are built and decorated with paintings, statutes, of Virgin Mary, Jesus and their saints etc. Churches are also generally square or rectangular in Shapes where cross is located either in the middle or in the corner There is also seating arrangements for the worshiper to listen sermons and sing holy song. Sunday is their worship day.

Mosques

Mosque is a Place of Muslim Worships. It is a Place of prostration on knees and bow down forehead until nose and forehead touches the floor or the dust of the earth to demonstrate their humblest submission and unconditional Obedience to the lord of all universes. Muslims offered their five times prayer at their proper time in congregation lead by Imams of Masjid.

Mosques are generally square or rectangular in shape. Its structure is free from all images, figures and statutes etc. Its ceiling is centrally domed the most important part of its construction that its mihrab which indicates exact direction of Qibla is always towards. Mecca. Mihrab is rich at the base wall of Qibla in the exact direction of Merca there is pulpit or member which is often made of wood is against wall of Qibla on the right side of Mihrabs. Pulpit is located in centre of Masjid. Pulpit is used for sermon by imam and religious scholars. Minrates are located on both sides of Mosques

Floor is carpeted with mats. Mosques may have rooms for library. or learning Quran a hadith and other religious subjects. There are also arrangements of ablution and washing according to mosques resources. Masjid is however a place of perfect peace of heart and soul for Muslims.

Temples

Hinduism is also third great religion in the World and is based on Polytheize. Their worship places are called temples. Hindus have puja room in their houses where they do puja to their deities at ease. They worship in their temples which are in different in shapes and sizes these are rectangular, octagonal, Semi, circle.

Hindu performs their daily prayer at home in puja room where they have picture, statute and his scripture. In Temple they often go for Bhajan, Kirtans hymns singing holy songs etc. At sunset they do Puja (Which is devotionals worship) called Arti with five basic elements which includes (fire, earth, water, Air, Either) in a Small tray. contain all these elements. Then temple have steeple dome. The highest point of steeple dome is called shikhara (Summit). The verandah of Temple is broad. It may be square in shape or has dome.



Jewish place of Worship

There are many names of Jewish places of worship such as synagogue, Shul, belt congregation and Temple etc. The most significant things in Jewish Temple are the Ark, a Cabinet or curtains that holds the torah scroll. The ark doors or curtains can remain open or







closed. The Ark is the most sacred place in the temple. Ark originally, was movable chest now it is a, fixed cupboard Often It is covered with elegant curtain, Above the Ark-aron halcodesh (aron mean cupboard) hand and near tamed the eternal light which to most of jews what make it synagogue

Buddhism

In the earliest of Buddhism there were simply mounds of earth. Later they came to build with bricks and other materials their worship Places are called stupa, But in different countries has different forms and names in Japan stupa are called pagodas. In Tibet Chortens, in Sri Lanka dagobas. Indian stupa is ball shaped, Japanese Pagodas became taller and slenderer, thas a small shrine attached to it. In stupa relies of Buddha are placed in a gold box and images of Buddha. There are also rooms for worshippers to do meditation urge and Puja etc. They also read out holy books sing bhajan etc.

Gurdwara

A Gurudwara is a place of worship for Sikhs. People from all faiths and even atheists are welcomed in Gurdwara. This is the reasons, gurdwara has four entrances.

Gurudwara Singh Sabha Alken was founded in 2015 Gurudwara house Darbar Sahib is also known as the dewan hall (prayer room) which refers to the main hall within in a Sikh Gurudwara. This hall is where the holy Scripture - the Guru Granth Sahib is placed on a throne in a prominent central position.

It also houses our Langar hall. Langar, also known as the community kitchen, is an integral part of the Gurudwara Sahib. The Langar brings the community together, eliminates caste system and serves people in need. A Gurudwara can be identified from a distance by tall flagpoles bearing the Nishan Sahib, the Sikh flag

Sikhism has no room for symbolism or ritualism; Sikhs have neither idols nor altars in their Gurudwara. They have no sacraments and no priestly order. The essential feature of a gurudwara is the presiding presence in it of the holy Sikh Scripture, called the Guru Granth Sahib also referred to as Sat guru. This essentially is the focal point of a Gurdwara. The other main component is the holy congregation called the Sadh Sangat who are present within this sacred structure in humble obedience 10 principles laid down by the Sikh Gurus.

Hindu Calendar

Hindu Calendar is the traditional astrology calendar of India which has been in use since ancient times. The Hindu Calendar 'also called Panchang or Panchanga, is used to determine the time and dates of Hindu festivals, religious ceremonies, mahurat timing etc, making it an inseparable piece of Indian culture.

Both lonic /solar as well as solar calendar is in use in India. Lunar calendar months strictly follow the lunar cycle of two Junar fortnights (Shukla paksha & Krishna paksha). Laceratingly, lunisolar calendar is basically a lunar calendar which has some intercalation rules to synchronize it with the Solar year.

- d) Wear clean and decent dress according to the requirement of the place.
- e) Use always decent language with soft accent.
- f) Do not sneeze and cough without handkerchief.
- g) If you are to open a door for someone to enter, keep the door open until he enters thereafter door is to be closed slowly and gently.
- h) Make habit to be punctual at every place.
- i) During conversation always listen other attentively with respect and do not interfere.
- i) Never speak loudly and use abusive language.
- k) Avoid discussing controversial issues.
- 1) Pay respect to everyone, listen him/her whether is junior in age and stature.
- m) Advise kindly.









- n) Keep and maintain cleanness and sanctity of the place.
- o) Not to spoil atmosphere and environment from any action.
- p) Shake hand or just give' a gesture and introduce your name. it makes easy for him to response friendly.

Social etiquette of a person is needed not only to men but for 'all living creatures, plants and nonliving things inducing atmosphere, and surrounding environment.  - 4. Remove and place sleepers/shoes at appropriate place
 - 5. Make a Wazu.
 - 6. Sit or perform prayer at easily available place
 - 7. Don't stretch your feet towards Qibla
 - 8. Don't talk or use mobile phone.
 - 9. Put cap or cover your head during prayer.

Church

- 1. Observe complete silence before religious proceeding on Sunday.
- 2. On Sunday the Holy Communion must be attended from beginning to end.
- 3. No clapping during church service.
- 4. Amen is to be said after each prayer

Judaism

Skullcap (Kippah) should be kept on the head and Tat lit a prayer shawl should have on the shoulders Either one should take part in it their worship which is continued for three to four hours or one should sit outside or join them, their divine book torah should not be placed on the floor. Should be kissed with esteem and placed on high place.

Buddhism





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Shoes and caps/ headgear should be left outside. Proper's dress/ trouser should be worn. Not to touch the statute of Gotham Buddha. Back at feet 2/3 steps and return Stand in homage when their priests enter. use rights hand in taking and giving anything. Enter with right foot in and exit with left foot out first.

- 16. Keep your money and other belongings inside pocket out be alert from pickpocket.
- 17. Get ready and extra alert before arrival of your destiny because mostly people hurriedly get down at their stops and loses their money and other belongings.

Long journey bus station

For long journey bus stop you need perfect planning and preparation.

- 1. Keep your hand bags is as simple as possible if il is a short time travel and you are returning same day or in few days.
- 2. If you are going on vacation then even try your baggage as simple as possible tightly. pack your goods with lock or rupees.
- 3. Keep relevant journey documents such as NIC, money enough for Journey. Ticket and address where you are going keep inside the pocket of your garment wearing on the day of Journey.
- 4. Reach bus stop of 15/20 minutes early.
- 5. load your baggage safely
- 6. Sit on your seat.
- 7. Observe all that rules of ethies and morality as you as in local travelling mentioned above.
- 8. However during long journey the coach stops intermittently at various stops. washing facilities a stopover cleanly.
- 9. Take light refreshment at stop over. Also keep check on driving and bus speed. sure the drives driving the bus safely as per traffic rules,
- 10. Talk friendly with all passengers particularly with neighboring passenger. Neither share eating stuff nor family information with unknown person in the journey At stopover bus be always near to your bus.
- 11. Show your identity to concern authorities wherever it is asked for.
- 12. If you are sick not travel. If Journey is necessary Then travel along with some relative so he takes care of you
- 13. If you are sting behind driver seat, neither talk, nor sleep/snap or do anything which disturb he concentration of driver,
- 14. If at the bus terminal someone is there to receive you it is good otherwise make sure you are not highly charged by cab drivers



Railway Station

Railway Journey is quite romantic and memorable event in life. Mostly People experience railway Journey a few times in their life. However those who are local traders or government or private employees in cities other than their native towns they travel regularly as long as their business or Job continues but generally railways journey is a very



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interesting and enjoyable experience for all persons of all ages. Definitely there are some essential preparations to enjoy this journey.

A planning is needed few days early, If going first time. As a regular customer at least one/two days before Journey.

His Student Alexander the great always loved and respected him, he used to send unique goods from his every conquered country to his tutor Aristotle, Alexander in praise Aristotle said that Aristotle like can produce thousands of Alexander the great can't produce one Aristotle.

When Alexander the great died in 323 BC. When Pro Macedonian government was over thrown, Aristotle charged with impiety for his association with the Alexander the great. He escaped from Athens to Euboea where he remained until his death a year later.

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CHAPTER 18

IMMANUEL KANT

Immanuel Kant is a German Philosopher and Pioneer of Western Philosophy. He actually belonged to Scotland. He was born in Johannesburg in 22 April 1724. He was 4th child of poor family. His father John Georg Kant was harness maker and was staunch follower of Pietism. From his childhood he also practiced religion strictly. He never married. He was short in height but his works in philosophy and in other branches of knowledge and education was of great height. He worked for completing his education. He was Philosopher. Professor, Educationist; he was also accomplished in physics, Math, Metaphysics etc. In his early education. he showed extraordinary interest in religion and taken classics, in 1740 enrolled as student of theology in Konigsberg University, in 1746 his father died. He left university to earn to support his family.

In 1755 returned to University. During this period he continued his philosophical writing on rationalism and empiricism. He Joined University as tutor and spent 15 years as tutor and professor. There he came in contact with lock and Home who were the two great philosophers at that time whose theories had created a great public excitement and commotion.

Kant after a great study and effort wrote and published Critique of Pure Reason in 1781 which described the importance of wisdom and character that our knowledge is limited for anything in the world.

To comprehend the Kant philosophy is very difficult to understand at this level however publication of critique of pure reason was to criticize and reject the philosophical concept of lesbianism that philosophy should model itself on mathematics and aim it constructing a chain of arguments.

He synthesized the early modem rationalism, and empiricism, His Philosophy exercised a great influence in Metaphysics. Epistemology. ethics, Political Philosophy aesthetics and other fields. The fundamental of Kant philosophy is exposed in his three critique of pure reason, and 1781 to 1787.

In 1781, Immanuel Kant published the Critique of Pure 6 Reason, an enormous work, and one of the most important on Western thought. He described that reason and experiences interact with thought and understanding. This enable man in understanding the world works. He applied the concept on ethics and the philosophical study of moral actions. He proposed a moral law called the "categorical imperative," stating that morality is derived from rationality and all moral judgments are rationally supported. What is right is right and what is wrong is wrong and religion or good is based on highest modality ground According





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to his deontological moral theory the highest moral standard task should done with bona fide intention without waiting for its result. Therefore, there is no confusion Human beings are obligated to follow this imperative unconditionally if they are to claim to be moral.

He based religion on moral values which is not derived from experience only. It is higher than experience. Whatever we want for us we should desire for other as to make the society better. We should keep our conscious clear and always follow the dictates of clean conscious. This is the basic of ethics.

In short Kant philosophy, teach man to understand and practice religion and believe in God and do goods for the people and society with absolute conviction and belief gained from philosophy, through metaphysics, gained rationalism and empiricism. Beside Kant also worked General natural history and theory of heavens, physical geography, galaxy etc. two students of university, Efharbarta AND Gotaleeb took the Kant philosophy as the subject of their education.

Kant died on 12 February 1804 in Konigsberg which is located in Ru

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CHAPTER 19

IMAM GHIZALI

Imam Ghizali

Imam Ghizali was one of the greatest religious Jurist, Theologian, mystical thinker he revived the faith by reconstructing religion science upon the Sufism. He was born in a poor family in Tus 450 Hijri, His father died early and left his two children Muhammad and Ahmad in the custody of a friend with little money for their education. They lived together as long as the money existed but when it finished, he left the both children in famous religious institution and deserted them,

He completed his religious education in Tus, Gurgan and Nishapur under Sheikh Ahmad Rao kani, Abu Nasar Ismail, and Imam ul Harman at Nishapur.

He learned Jurisprudence at early age in childhood. He strove earnestly and exalted himself and soon emerged as the most discerning man of his era, at Nishapur he attended the assembly of vizler Nizam ul Mulk and attained highest rank through his teaching and refined arguments. The gathering of Nizam ul Mulk was the flocking place of great scholars.

One incident also took place in his educational life that when he was returning from his school the dacoits intercepted, took away all his belonging including his two written copies containing articles on religion and philosophy, He searched out dacoits and recovered his two copies, Dacoit taunted him what was the use of such elm which was not transferred to the people. Probably it changed his mind. He memorized his written script and adopted preaching his lifelong profession. He devoted his entire life in search of knowledge and imparting knowledge to the people. After the death of Imam ul Harman, he joined the court Nizam ul Mulk and soon became the head of Nizamya college. He then taught Islamic Jurisprudence ethics, reasons he also worked to refute heresies from all segments of community He also became imam of Iraq and imam khoarsen.

He stayed at Nishapur for 28 year and continued his teaching profession Islamic subjects and philosophy, until 484 Hijri, after the death sultan Nizam ul Mulk and Imam ul Harmain. He renounced his teaching profession and wandered in Syria and Palestine in search of true knowledge.

During this period, he doubted reasons, philosophy as knowledge but divine guidance came to him, which restored his confidence in reason and philosophy. He now exclusively concentrated disciplining his souls changing his character traits, improving his, nature and life style. He was preparing himself for hereafter eternal abode. He now spent his time with spiritual travelers. Finally he attained highest spiritual state of mind and soul. He returned to his home land Tus where he spent rest of his life in Teaching, spiritual guidance to people, and in writing.









He died on 14th Jamaad Thariyah 505 Hijri. His shrine is in city of Tabran.

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CHAPTER 20

FLORENCE NIT ANGLE

Florence Nit angle is known as the Pioneer of modern Nursing, She was born at villa Colombia in Florence Tuscany Italy on 12 May 1820. She belonged to rich English family. Her father William Edward was elite land owner.

She got early education at home. Besides mathematics she' also learnt German, French and Italian languages. She had the passion to become a Nurse which in Those days was not only lowly menial labor Job but also not seen with respect Florence however determined to had a vocation of divine importance, in her childhood she used to Treat her dolls as her patients and herself as their, nurse despite her parents' disapproval she enrolled as nursing student in a institution of protestant Deaconesses in Kaiser Werth Germany. After the battle of Alma Britain there was uproar against sanitary conditions of hospital, medical staff and shortage of medicine. There was also no female nurse.

She got the Job as Nurse in Harley hospital London. As she was beautiful and belonged to a rich elite family, she attracted many good proposals but she turned down all of them and considered marriage as a hurdle to- his nursing mission.

When Crimea war broke out between Allies forces of British and France against Russia over Ottoman Empire. British army assigned her exclusive Nursing project to take care wounded soldiers at Scatter British army hospital in constant pole (Turkey). Unsanitary condition was extremely in a horrid State. The patients lay on their own excrement on stretcher strewn throughout the hallways. Rodents and bugs scurried around.

There were short of medicine and bandage etc. Florence Nit angle with small contingent of Nurses stayed there for one and half year. Improved the sanitary conditions of hospital, Kitchen established library, laundry etc. By 1854 count of wounded and injured soldiers reached to 18,000 but her nursing, management and day night care of patients, reduced the death rate to two third. At night with the lamp she used to visit patient from bed to bed. Patients used to call her lady with lamp and the angle of Crimea war when the war was over she returned to the childhood town in London.

Queen of Victoria gifted her broach to Florence and cash 250,000 ponds.

Florence invested this money in boasting his nursing passion. Established hospital and nursing training school.

She also wrote books on nursing and its management matter affecting health which benef5ited British government in improving hospitals. and nursing management in US civil war she was consulted improving nursing and taking care of wounded soldiers.





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She was awarded order of merit by King Edward in 1910 celebrity message by King George. 13 August 1910 she took a long rest in peace in family graveyard London all her funeral ceremonies according to her desire was simply carried out.
